



Prescribed Burning on Private Lands

Driving Directions to ALFA Environmental Hall at UWA in Livingston, AL:

FROM I 20/59: Traveling south on 20/59 from north Alabama, take the Livingston exit, (Exit 17). Turn left on Hwy 28 and travel approximately 1 mile. Turn right on Country Club Dr. immediately past the Western Inn Motel. After approximately $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile, turn left on Bartram Street into the Gardens Apartments. There will be a sign for the Training Center at the entrance to the Gardens. You will pass the apartment building on the right. At the top of the hill, follow pavement to the right until you will see the Training Center.

Whether you are a single tract landowner or manage thousands of acres, prescribed fire training should be part of your land management plan. Your fire application should be conducted in such a way to ensure that your management objectives will be met, while minimizing the likelihood for escaped fire and smoke liability. This one-day workshop will outline benefits of using fire as a management tool on your property, where to go and who to contact when you need assistance, when to burn to meet your management objectives, and how to create a burn plan for safety and success.

This one day workshop costs \$10/participant and includes lunch, refreshments, and transportation to and from the site visit of J&M Farms.
