## What are your specific educational objectives?

- o What do you want students to be able to do, demonstrate, discuss?
- o How will you articulate those to students?

#### What pre-existing knowledge will students possess related to the subject?

- o How will you know what they know?
- o How can you build upon that knowledge?
- o How might that knowledge impede learning?

### Are your students expert or novice?

- o Experts incorporate new knowledge into existing framework
- Novices need to develop that framework
- o Mixing the two can be challenging

## What information do you need to convey in advance?

o What mechanism will be most effective for the information type?

# What activities will you use in the field sites?

- o Are the activities well suited to the knowledge/skill objectives?
- o Does the site effectively support the activities?

#### How will encourage student-to-student interaction?

- o Individual, small group, larger group elements?
- o Team activities, group experimentation on techniques?

#### How will you encourage reflection, analysis, and application?

- o Mindfulness exercise?
- o Group discussion?
- o Process map?

#### How will you instill a sense of context?

- o Where does this lesson fit in the course?
- o Where does this knowledge fit in the subject area?
- o Where does this skill set fit in their potential career?
- o How can this information/skill help them meet their personal objectives?

## How will you provide feedback that helps students progress in the learning process?

- o Real-time check-ins?
- o Questions that challenge understanding?

#### How will you motivate students to invest in learning?

- o Context/value?
- o Social interaction?
- o Rewarding feedback?

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
